

Jeff Sowder Elected Imperial Potentate

This Imperial Year Will Focus Primarily on Membership Growth

Jeffrey L. Sowder of Toronto, Kansas, was elected Imperial Potentate, part of the 12-member body that helps govern the Shriners fraternity, during the Shriners' 2019 Imperial Session – held in Nashville, Tennessee, June 30 – July 4.

A Bit of Background

Jeff has lived in Toronto (population 275) his entire life. In fact, four generations of the Sowder family have been residents of the tiny town. He has worked for the family business (which he has expanded to four successful companies) forever and been married to his high school sweetheart, Cheryl, for 45 years. They live in the same 125-year-old house they initially purchased, although they have added to it over the years. Today, the family includes Jeff and Cheryl's two daughters, and their families: Stephanie, her husband, Jamie, and their children, Corinne, Sutton and Reid; and Lindsay, her husband, John, and their sons JJ and Hudson.

Becoming a Mason

Toronto may not have a single stop light, but it has values – Masonic values. The town has been home to a Masonic lodge for 148 years. His father, and several other men Jeff knew growing up, were Masons. "Everyone I looked up to was a Mason. They were all dedicated, successful, nice people," said Jeff. "I always knew it was going to happen for me."

And, of course, it did – when he was 19. Ultimately, he became a leader of Masonry in Kansas. Drawing on his abilities to be focused and determined, Jeff successfully led a fundraising effort to raise \$15 million in four years for cancer research at Kansas University, allowing the school to be designated as a National Cancer Institute, under the name Kansas Masonic Research Institute.

"This put Kansas Masonry on the map," said Jeff.
"It was one of the most rewarding things I've ever done."
Jeff served in many Masonic leadership positions in
Kansas, including as Grand Master in 1997, as a board
member of the Kansas Masonic Foundation for 25 years,
and as its President from 2004 to 2011.

Taking the Next Step

Jeff's father was also a Shriner. But the local temple was 100 miles away, in Wichita, Kansas, making it somewhat difficult to be active. Still, Jeff became a Shriner, as well, joining Midian Shriners in Wichita in 1988.

Eventually he became involved in temple leadership, and ultimately, the subject of becoming Oriental Guide and joining the "line," a commitment of five years, came up.



Jeff and Cheryl discussed it and decided to go for it. This was the first of many such conversations, all of which ended with the same conclusion – lead and make a difference.

"I have the greatest Shrine wife in the world – she has been right there, involved, since day one."

He served as Potentate of Midian Shriners in 2004.
Back in the 1990s, Jeff had met and become friends with one of the most beloved and respected Shriners, the late Imperial Sir, lack H. Jones, who invited leff to

the late Imperial Sir Jack H. Jones, who invited Jeff to help with the annual Membership Seminar; after a few years of working together, Jack began suggesting Jeff run for the Imperial line. Jeff was elected Imperial Outer Guard in 2009.

The Power of One

When Jeff was working to raise those funds for cancer research, he discovered the power of one – the difference one person can make. That lesson of Just One has become a belief and a guiding force in his life. He has used it to inspire his fellow nobles to, one by one, increase membership, and he will use it throughout his year as Imperial Potentate to remind us all that each one of us matters, has a responsibility to our fraternity and philanthropy, and can make a difference.






