Honoring and Remembering Imperial Sir Jack Jones



This issue of *The Public Relations Voice* is dedicated to Imperial Sir Jack H. Jones, who passed away on Thursday, April 27, 2017. Imperial Sir Jones personified what it means to be a Mason and a Shriner, and worked continuously to strengthen the Masonic family.

A Treasured and Beloved Leader and Friend

Imperial Sir Jones worked tirelessly for nearly 40 years to support and serve the fraternity at the national level. He served Shriners International as Imperial Recorder for more than 35 years, Executive Vice President for five, Imperial Potentate for one, and received countless accolades and honors, including the Imperial Potentate's Award of Merit, which is the highest honor in the fraternity. Imperial Sir Jones was also known as one of the most dedicated and genuine people to work alongside – a reputation he earned by leading the fraternity with grace and pride.

He was initially elected Imperial Recorder in 1979, and served in that position, or as Imperial Potentate, until his death.

During much of his time as Imperial Recorder, he also served as Corporate Director of Membership Development. Imperial Sir Jones also served as Chairman of the Masonic Relations and DeMolay Committees during the majority of this time.

As Imperial Potentate, he focused on bringing people together, developing modern membership solutions and recognizing the fraternity's global impact and its potential. His theme for the year was "Unity Wins." He was a frequent speaker at Masonic events throughout the world, and was a well-known and well-respected Masonic leader. Imperial Sir Jones was interviewed last year for *Shriner Magazine: Pride and Tradition.* We are pleased to share some of his thoughts from that conversation:

Of his reputation for graciousness, he said, "I've always wanted to treat people as I've wanted to be treated. And I enjoy meeting people and visiting with them, getting their thoughts, ideas and opinions, because I like to consider those opinions even though I may not agree with them. I've always tried to be as courteous and helpful as I can.

"I feel honored to have been able to serve this great fraternity," he said. "I am extremely grateful for the kindness and cooperation given to me by the representatives and the nobility."

When asked about what he will always remember about being a Shriner, Imperial Sir Jones said, "The great friends that I have met, the members I've met through the years, great friendships, and wonderful people who have become more like regular family members – the fun and fellowship."

And here in the corporate public relations department at Shriners International Headquarters, we will forever remember and miss his friendly face and uplifting voice as he came down the hallway, taking the time to say hello to each and every one of us.

"Imperial Sir Jack Jones has been a fixture on the boards of Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children for decades," said Imperial Potentate Chris Smith. "With the passing of Jack Jones, all Masons and all Shriners have experienced a great loss. He was a truly great Shriner, an example to all."

The Grand Lodge of New York Honors Imperial Sir Jack Jones with Distinguished Service Award

Monday, May 1, was expected to be a day of celebration and honor, as Imperial Sir Jack Jones was to receive the Distinguished Service Award from the Grand Lodge of New York, a distinction he received posthumously. Illustrious Sir Mark Buono, Potentate of Mecca Shriners, accepted the award on behalf of Imperial Sir Jones.

A letter from Imperial Potentate Chris Smith addressed to Most Worshipful Jeffrey Williamson, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of New York, was read during the presentation. The letter said, "While we are deeply saddened, and will grieve the loss of our exceptional brother, friend and leader for a long time to come, Jack would want – and expect – us to continue on with honor, grace and fortitude.

"Jack was loved by everyone who worked with and for him, and was known for his dedication and gentle, kind and gracious spirit. We will honor him – and his memory – by remembering his example, and doing our best to live into it, and he will remain in our hearts forever."

The Philadelphia Shriners Hospital hosted some special guests recently. To kick-off an exciting week of 2017 NFL Draft activities, 22 of the prospects visited the hospital to interact with the patients, and share an extraordinary and memorable event.

As part of the NFL Play 60 initiative, kids of all ability levels are encouraged to be active for 60-minutes each day. The NFL Play 60 All-Ability Guide (live link to <u>https://www.shrinershospitalsforchildren.org/education/</u><u>play60</u>),created when the NFL teamed up with Shiners Hospitals for Children, offers ideas for interactive adaptive play activities for children with varying physical abilities to help them have an active life.

Throughout the event, the NFL prospects participated alongside the patients in various all-ability activities, including ultimate football, fitness stations and footballthemed art projects.

A Successful Event

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia Administrator Ed Myers said, "We are fortunate that the Chicago Shriners Hospital has taken part in the same event for the last two years. When the NFL announced the draft was coming to Philadelphia, we hoped we would benefit from a Play 60 [event], too."

"Our kids really had a lot of fun," said Mary Ann Roberto, child life specialist. "You could feel the excitement in the air for the patients and the prospects. They really seemed to interact and bond with each other, providing an experience I think neither will ever forget."

Excellent Media Coverage

In addition to facilitating this amazing opportunity for patients and the NFL prospects, the Philadelphia



Shriners Hospital also acted as the main media hub for the day. More than 100 media outlets were able to capture footage of the event and interview several of the prospects on the special media floor. The event was covered by FOX, <u>ABC</u>, <u>Penn Live</u> and <u>USA Today</u>, among others.

Alec, 14, an aspiring sports broadcaster and Chicago Shriners Hospital patient, interviewed draft prospects during the event. Alec has osteogenesis imperfecta (also known as brittle bone disease), and has starred in several Shriners Hospitals for Children commercials.

Superheroes of Summer Safety

Our 2017 summer safety campaign kicked off on May 22, and Shriners Hospitals for Children is asking everyone – kids, parents, hospital staff and Shriners – to #EarnYourCape and become *Superheroes of Summer Safety* in their communities by sharing tips to reduce the risk of childhood injuries. This year we've enlisted the National Association of School Nurses (NASN), as well as Shriner, NASCAR driver and Love to the rescue[®] Ambassador David Ragan to help us spread the word.

With the help of NASN, Shriners Hospitals has already distributed more than 175,000 *Superheroes of Summer Safety* activity books to school nurses, teachers, parents and children across the country. These books provide a fun and informative way for kids to learn how they can stay injury-free in the summer months.

Ragan kicked-off the campaign near his hometown of Charlotte, North Carolina, with a media event at a local elementary school playground. He will continue to spread the message about ways to stay safe this summer during events at several Shriners Hospitals and NASCAR races throughout the season.

Here are some ways you can use this campaign and its resource materials to promote Shriners Hospitals for Children as a partner in summer safety and a leader in specialized pediatric care.

Distribute Summer Safety Materials:
